



### **Special Priests' Medical Insurance Collection**

On Sat/Sun October 13/14, our Eparchy will once again take a special collection to help subsidize the medical insurance premiums of our pastors. Your outstanding generosity in the previous collections has been extremely helpful. Bishop John asks each household to pray and consider what it can contribute this year. Medical insurance premiums are very expensive and continually on the rise. How does our little Eparchy manage to pay this monthly premium? The parishes pay a large portion of the premium for their priest while the Eparchy picks up the difference which also includes active and retired priests not assigned to parishes. Have you noticed some of the changes we’ve been making this past year to do our part for the environment? We have slowly changed over most of our items to compostable paper products, and improving our sorting of trash, recyclables and compost.
